The last several months have seen an intensive period of work for the Hauraki Collective and iwi Treaty negotiators, with two more important milestones having been achieved.

The 12 Iwi of Hauraki have all concluded full Crown recognised mandates to negotiate comprehensive Treaty of Waitangi settlements. And, 12 iwi agreement in principle equivalents have been completed for the Hauraki region. This has progressed our Treaty negotiations to the next level from the Hauraki Framework Agreement signed with the Crown in October 2010, and provides a durable platform for achieving our deeds of settlement in 2012.

These milestones are discussed in more detail in this edition of He Aute Te Awhea. They will be also discussed further in the ongoing hui a iwi facilitated by the mandated negotiators.

Finally, a warm acknowledgement of the significant work undertaken by Glen Tupuhi and Mapuna Turner during their time as interim Treaty negotiators for Ngati Paoa and Ngati Rahiri Tumutumu respectively. They have been hard working representatives for their iwi. And, a warm welcome to Morehu Wilson and Nicola Green who have been mandated by their iwi to carry on the work.

Iwi Mandates Recognised by the Crown

The 12 Iwi of Hauraki have all concluded Crown recognised mandates to negotiate full settlements of their historical Treaty of Waitangi claims.

The mandate recognition has been many years in the making and provides a durable platform for the iwi to realise their Treaty settlement aspirations.

The last part of the process which led to Crown mandate recognition involved the public notification of iwi deeds of mandate, direct notifications to Wai claimants, a period for public submissions and a Crown assessment process by the Office of Treaty Settlements and Te Puni Kokiri.

- Each of the deeds:
- * Discuss the iwi
 - * Describe the claim area
 - * Set out accountability processes, including provision by which negotiators can be appointed, replaced and removed
 - * List the Wai claims to be negotiated by each iwi.

NGĀI TAI KI TĀMAKI

The mandated authority is the Ngāi Tai ki Tāmaki Tribal Trust and the negotiators are James Brown, Carmen Kirkwood, Laurie Beamish and Lucy Steel.

The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Ngāi Tai ki Tāmaki claims): Wai 96, Wai 236, Wai 357, Wai 423, Wai 960, Wai 1749 and Wai 1825.

NGĀTI HAKO

The Ngāti Hako negotiators are Josie Anderson and John Linstead.

The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Ngāti Hako claims): Wai 100, Wai 364, Wai 373, Wai 650 and Wai 728.

NGĀTI HEI

The Ngāti Hei negotiators are Peter Tiki Johnston, Joe Davis and Peter Matai Johnston.

The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Ngāti Hei claims): Wai 100, Wai 110, Wai 705, Wai 969 and Ngāti Hei 'Blue Water' claim.

NGĀTI MARU

The Ngāti Maru negotiators are Wāti Ngamane and Paul Majurey.

The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Ngāti Maru claims): Wai 100, Wai 174, Wai 177, Wai 285, Wai 355, Wai 454, Wai 464, Wai 495, Wai 661, Wai 694, Wai 720, Wai 811, Wai 812, Wai 865, Wai 867, Wai 970, Wai 1696, Wai 1807, Wai 1891, Wai 2007, Wai 2080, Wai 2272 and Wai 2300.

NGĀTI PĀOA

The mandated authority is the Ngāti Pāoa Trust Board and the negotiators are Hauauru Eugene Rawiri and Morehu Wilson.



The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Ngāti Pāoa claims): Wai 72, Wai 100, Wai 808, Wai 810, Wai 345, Wai 563, Wai 1530, Wai 1901, Wai 1696, Wai 1702, Wai 1807, Wai 1825, Wai 1889, Wai 1891, Wai 2007, Wai 2300, Wai 2298, Wai 2272, Wai 2169, Wai 2080, Wai 2039, Wai 2037 and Wai 2035.

NGĀTI POROU KI HAURAKI

The mandated authority is Te Runanga o Ngāti Porou Ki Hauraki and the negotiators are John Tamihere and Fred Thwaites.

The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Ngāti Porou ki Hauraki claims): Wai 289, Wai 792 and Wai 866.

NGĀTI PUKENGA

The mandated authority is Te Au Maaro o Ngāti Pukenga and the negotiators are Awanuiarangi Black, Raheha Ohia and Shane Ashby.

The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Ngāti Pukenga claims): Wai 148 and Wai 285.

NGĀTI RĀHIRI TUMUTUMU

The mandated authority is the Ngāti Tumutumu Ngāti Rāhiri Settlements Committee and the negotiators are Jill Taylor and Nicola Green.

The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Ngāti Rāhiri Tumutumu claims): Wai 100, Wai 373, Wai 663, Wai 686, Wai 695 and the Te Aroha Block Claim.

NGĀTI TAMATERĀ

The Ngāti Tamaterā negotiators are Liane Ngamane and John McEnteer.

The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Ngāti Tamaterā claims): Wai 100, Wai 177, Wai 349, Wai 373, Wai 418, Wai 650, Wai 720, Wai 728, Wai 778, Wai 968, Wai 1807, Wai 1891, Wai 2272, Wai 2300.

NGĀTI TARA TOKANUI

The Ngāti Tara Tokanui negotiators are Russell Karu and Amelia Williams.

The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Ngāti Tara Tokanui claims): Wai 100, Wai 714 and Wai 686.

NGĀTI WHANAUNGA

The mandated authority is the Ngāti Whanaunga Incorporated Society and the negotiators are Rodney Renata and Tipa Compain.

The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Ngāti Whanaunga claims): Wai 346, Wai 720, Wai 809, Wai 811, Wai 812, Wai 1696, Wai 1807, Wai 1891 and Wai 2007.

TE PATUKIRIKIRI

The Te Patukirikiri negotiators are William Peters and David Williams.

The historical Treaty of Waitangi claims include (insofar as they are historical Te Patukirikiri claims): Wai 100, Wai 349, Wai 495, Wai 720, Wai 728 and Wai 811.



Agreements In Principle Equivalent

On 22 July 2011, the mandated Treaty negotiators for each of the 12 Iwi of Hauraki and the Minister of Treaty of Waitangi Negotiations signed iwi specific agreement in principle equivalents.

This represents the latest key step in the Treaty negotiations process, and builds upon the Hauraki Framework Agreement signed in October 2010. These settlement instruments pave the way towards comprehensive deeds of settlement between the Crown and the Iwi of Hauraki.

The Agreement in Principle Equivalents record the progress made in the Hauraki region negotiations to date as well as the settlement aspirations of the Iwi of Hauraki. They each contain a Collective chapter and an Iwi-specific chapter. The Collective chapter includes agreed historical account headings and historical account headings that the Hauraki Collective seeks. Also included are statements on collective cultural and commercial redress.

The iwi-specific chapters include unique sections which cover:

- ✦ agreed historical account headings;
- ✦ historical account themes each iwi seeks;
- ✦ particular redress each iwi seeks; and
- ✦ appendices identifying areas and properties over which each iwi seek cultural and commercial redress.

The appendices include descriptions of places within the Hauraki region that are significant to each of the Iwi of Hauraki.

In his recent letter to the Hauraki Collective, the Minister stated:

"I thank you, the Hauraki Collective, and each of the 12 Iwi of Hauraki for your dedication and hard work which were key to reaching this important Treaty settlement milestone.

...

I again congratulate the Hauraki Collective and the Iwi of Hauraki on making significant progress in your Treaty settlement negotiations and I look forward to making a formal offer and concluding a Deed of Settlement in 2012. It is also a real achievement to now have mandates recognised for each of the Iwi of Hauraki."
